<b>Required Measures</b>			
<b>Protecting Patient Information</b>	<u>EHR Security Risk Analysis</u> : Conduct or review a security risk analysis of EPHI data created by EHR, implement updates, correct deficiencies as needed.		Yes Attestation Statement
<b>Electronic Prescribing</b>	Generate and transmit permissible prescriptions electronically that are also queried for formulary compliance.	Up to 10%	Numerator & Denominator
<b>Provider to Patient Exchange</b>	Patients are given access to their patient portal within 4 business days of their office visit to ensure they have timely access to view online, download, and transmit their information. *If the patient declines the portal, please note in designated field of your EHR *Once the patient is setup (or declines), no action is needed on subsequent office visits	Up to 40%	Numerator & Denominator
<b>Health Information Exchange: Support Electronic Referral Loops</b>	<u>Sending Health Information</u> : Clinician sends a summary of care electronically when transitioning or referring <u>any</u> patients to another setting of care or health care provider. Clinician must create the summary of care and electronically exchange the record using their EHR (e-fax does not count).	Up to 20% sending	Numerator & Denominator
	<u>Receiving and Incorporating Health Information</u> : For new or patients transitioned into your care (referral), the clinician conducts clinical information reconciliation for medications, medication allergy, and current problem list.	Up to 20%, accepting	Numerator & Denominator
<b>Registry Reporting</b>	Clinician is in active engagement to submit data to <u>two</u> of the following registries (or submit exclusions): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Clinical Data Registry</li> <li>• Electronic Case Reporting Registry</li> <li>• Immunization Registry</li> <li>• Public Health Registry</li> <li>• <i>Syndromic Surveillance Reporting (not in MD)</i></li> </ul>	10%	Yes/No Statement
<b>Available Bonus Points</b>			
<b>Query of PDMP</b>	For at least one Schedule II opioid electronically prescribed, the clinician uses their EHR to query PDMP (Prescription Drug Monitoring Program) for prescription drug history; Maryland uses CRISP.	5% bonus – at least one patient in the numerator will earn 5 points	Numerator & Denominator
<b>Verify Opioid Treatment Agreement</b>	For at least one patient for whom a Schedule II opioid was e-Prescribed, if the total duration is at least 30 days within a 6-month look-back period, the clinician identifies the existence of a signed opioid treatment agreement and incorporates it into the patient's record.	5% bonus – at least one patient in the numerator will earn 5 points	Numerator & Denominator
